## Secretary-Treasurer and Principal Officer Jeff Padellaro



Dear Sisters & Brothers:

As we look forward to Summer your Local Union is busy working for and on your behalf to preserve, protect

and improve your working conditions each and every day.

We have just recently ratified the new First Student National Contract. I am pleased to report that, for the first time in history, this national agreement contains actual economic standards that will apply across the country. This new contract mandates, healthcare, retirement and minimum guarantees. This historic agreement was overwhelmingly ratified by the membership.

I would also be remiss if I did not recognize the major role that your Local 633 representatives played in the negotiation of this new national agreement. Business Agent Keith Judge, Shop Steward Kelly Plaisted and I helped

to craft this ground breaking agreement. Special thanks to General President Sean O'Brien for giving us this opportunity.

I am also pleased to announce the near unanimous ratification of two historic new contracts at Pepsi, Manchester. The new agreements cover our members in Warehouse, Fleet, Sales and Pre-Sell. These new contracts provide never before seen increases in wages, as well as historic pension increases and enhanced job security language.

2026 is shaping up to be a major political year. This fall we will see the mid-term elections, and per usual, Local 633 will be in the center of the action. We have open invites to any and all candidates, regardless of party affiliation, to come speak to the membership and answer questions from the members. In the next newsletter, we will be providing a breakdown of those candidates that have committed to advocating for and on behalf of working families. Through our DRIVE program, we have been able to secure solid bi-partisan support for legislation that is important to working men and women. Most recently we have, once again this year, beaten back Right to Work (for less) legislation. I am also proud to announce that we have been able to pass legislation that offers additional protection(s) for our bus drivers. I would like to recognize Rob Everett of First

Student, Nashua, for his efforts and participation in support of this legislation. Rob attended multiple hearings on this legislation and testified in support. Local 633's success in political circles is due solely to the participation of our members. When we all work together there is nothing we cannot accomplish.

Once again, this Summer we have membership opportunities for coming together at Local 633 sponsored events. On July 19, 2026 we will be taking our friends from Camp Allen to a day at the beach. Beginning around 9:30 a.m., the membership volunteers of Local 633 will converge on Hampton Beach State Park for a day full of swimming, great food and great music. This is only possible through our dedicated volunteers. I encourage everyone to join us!

On September 20, 2026, we will be having our Local 633 Golf Tournament. This shotgun start event will begin at 8:30 a.m. with registration AT 8:00 a.m. Breakfast and Lunch will be provided. The application for participation is contained in this newsletter. Please be aware, this event is very popular, and sells out almost every year. Registration is first come first serve, so register early.

## Business Agent Keith Judge's Report



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I hope this newsletter finds you and your families well. The first half of 2026 has been exceptionally busy here at Local 633. Since our last newsletter, we have secured significant victories across several industries and continued the important work of protecting and advancing the interests of our members.

Under the leadership of Principal Officer Jeff Padellaro, Local 633 has continued to secure strong contract victories across school transportation, warehousing, waste, bakery, brewery, and soft drink distribution. These accomplishments are a direct result of engaged members, dedicated stewards, and the solidarity that continues to define our Local.

I would also like to take a moment to thank the membership for your support as we prepare to attend the Teamsters International Convention. It is both an honor and a privilege to have been elected to represent the hardworking members of Teamsters Local 633. I look forward to bringing your voice and concerns to the Convention and helping shape the future of our Union.

Here is a look at some of the activity taking place throughout our Local.

### First Student – Belmont

This year, we successfully ratified a new collective bargaining agreement for our members at First Student Belmont. The agreement includes significant improvements, including increased wages, more affordable health insurance, and enhanced retirement benefits. The contract was overwhelmingly approved by the membership.

The agreement also provided substantial improvements for the Maintenance Technicians. However, the technicians initially rejected the contract because First Student failed to honor the

members' demand to recognize Veterans Day as a paid holiday. The technicians unanimously voted the agreement down and authorized a strike.

Following additional discussions with the company, we are pleased to report that we successfully secured Veterans Day as a recognized holiday. The technicians subsequently ratified their agreement, resulting in a strong contract for the entire bargaining unit.

The Drivers and Technicians in Belmont demonstrated exactly what unity and solidarity can accomplish. Their willingness to stand together sent a clear message to the company and resulted in a stronger agreement for all members.

I would like to thank everyone in Belmont for their support and dedication to our Union. A special thank you goes to Shop Steward and Trustee Kelly Plaisted, who served on the negotiating committee and worked tirelessly to advocate for the improvements we achieved.

As the school year comes to a close, I hope everyone enjoys a safe and healthy summer. I look forward to seeing many of you

at our summer events and, before long, at startup for another successful school year.

### **First Student – Tilton/Bristol**

It has been another successful year for our members in Tilton and Bristol. While every school year presents its challenges, the Tilton/Bristol location remains one of the few First Student operations in New Hampshire that both started and finished the school year with a surplus of drivers.

Having enough qualified drivers to cover the work helps reduce stress on the workforce and improves overall operations throughout the year.

As we head into the summer months, I hope everyone has the opportunity to spend quality time with family and friends. Thank you for your continued dedication and professionalism throughout the school year. Have a safe and enjoyable summer, and we look forward to seeing everyone again at startup in the fall.

### **Associated Grocers of New England (AGNE)**

The past six months have been extremely busy at AGNE as we prepare for upcoming contract negotiations while simultaneously navigating the challenges of the peak season.

We have held several proposal meetings and distributed bargaining surveys to ensure every member has an opportunity to have their voice heard and submit proposals for consideration. The bargaining committee is currently reviewing those proposals and preparing for negotiations.

On the transportation side, Stewards Steve Zajaceskowski and Karl Ulrich have done an outstanding job keeping members informed and engaged throughout the preparation process. Their leadership and communication have helped ensure that members understand both the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead.

While wages, health insurance, and pension improvements remain the top priorities of the membership, it is increasingly clear that one of the most significant issues we will face during this round of bargaining will be workplace technology, including in-cab cameras and the growing integration of Artificial Intelligence.

Your bargaining committee intends to pursue strong contractual protections regarding the use of AI and camera technology. Technology should never be used to undermine workers' rights, replace fair management practices, or create unreasonable surveillance in the workplace.

In the warehouse, congratulations are in order for newly elected Shop Stewards Alex Colby and Kevin Breed. Both members earned the confidence of their coworkers in a highly contested election, and we look forward to working alongside

them as they begin their stewardship responsibilities.

Over the next several months, representatives from Allegiant Care and the Pension Fund will be visiting the facility to answer questions regarding healthcare benefits, retirement planning, and pension benefits. As we continue preparing for negotiations, it has become abundantly clear that wages, healthcare costs, pension improvements, and the attendance policy remain among the membership's top priorities. Your bargaining committee will work diligently to improve all aspects of the agreement and bring back the strongest contract possible for your consideration.

Staffing continues to be a challenge in the warehouse. To address the issue and reduce mandatory overtime, the Union negotiated a temporary agreement allowing limited supplemental labor during the peak season. This agreement establishes strict start and end dates, protects bargaining unit work, guarantees that Teamsters who wish to work overtime will continue to have that opportunity, and requires the company to continue hiring bargaining unit employees. If staffing levels improve before the end of the peak season, the supplemental labor arrangement will end.

As negotiations approach, member involvement and solidarity will be critical to securing the strongest possible agreement.

### **UPS**

As always, it has been a busy year throughout our UPS facilities, and the pace will only increase as we move into the summer months.

With rising temperatures comes an increased risk of heat-related illness. Every member should take the time to review and understand the protections provided under Article 18 of the National Master Agreement and applicable supplements. If additional breaks, water, or time to cool down are necessary, protect yourself and exercise your contractual rights.

This message applies not only to package car drivers but also to our part-time and inside employees. Package cars, trailers, and warehouse facilities can reach dangerous temperatures during the summer months. Your health and safety must always come first.

Throughout Local 633, UPS stewards continue to hold weekly parking lot meetings to keep members informed about current events and workplace issues. As the company continues to test the limits of our contract, these meetings provide valuable information about the latest challenges and strategies for protecting our rights.

I encourage every member to attend these meetings whenever possible. Our stewards do an outstanding job communicating important information and helping members fight back against the company's ongoing attempts to erode contractual protections.

I would also like to personally thank all of our UPS stewards for the countless hours they dedicate to enforcing the contract, educating members, and holding the company accountable every day. Their commitment and leadership are essential to protecting the rights of our membership.

Over the next several months, we have developed a program that will allow each building's shop steward to attend a Northeast Area Parcel Grievance Committee (NEAPGC) panel hearing. This initiative will provide stewards with firsthand experience observing the grievance process and allow them to bring valuable knowledge back to the shop floor.

Because the NEAPGC is comprised of Teamster Locals throughout New England, it will also provide stewards with the opportunity to network with fellow representatives who are facing many of the same issues at UPS. We believe this program will significantly strengthen our steward network and improve our ability to enforce the contract.

As we head into the summer, we also have a full schedule of Teamsters truck and trailer visits planned throughout the Local, including UPS facilities. Representatives from Allegiant Care and the Pension Fund will be available to answer questions and provide information regarding healthcare benefits, retirement planning, and pension benefits.

### Camp Allen

Our annual Camp Allen event is scheduled for July 19th.

This event provides a wonderful opportunity to give back to the community while spending a great day at Hampton Beach with fellow Teamster families and the campers of Camp Allen.

Camp Allen remains one of the finest examples of what the labor movement can accomplish when we come together in service to our communities. It is a day that showcases the very best of Teamster values—solidarity, compassion, and giving back.

This event is made possible through the generosity of numerous Teamster employers, including Associated Grocers, UPS, Coca-Cola, Pepsi, Bimbo Bakeries, First Student, and STA, all of whom donate food, transportation, entertainment, and other resources.

The UPS show truck will once again be on display, and there will be activities for the entire family. We hope you and your family will join us for this outstanding Teamster tradition.

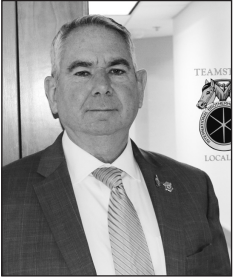

# Business Agent William Cahill's Report



Business Agent Report From  
William R. Cahill, Jr., Esq.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Local 633 prioritizes high quality continuing education of our stewards by offering annual steward training which includes breakout sessions for our private and public sector bargaining units. The steward training focuses on identifying grievances, documenting grievances, and assisting our sisters and brothers in identifying the Five W's- *who, what, where, when, and why*. Additionally, our stewards are trained to ask the grievant what the Grievant's expected resolution is. Some of our members have a bifurcated grievance system. For example, some issues are resolved by the usual process which involves the presentation of the grievance to employer representatives who are superior to the supervisor whose actions caused the grievance; other bargaining units, such as our Department of Corrections Units, must appeal to an outside panel such as the Personnel Appeals Board (PAB) for resolution of certain specific grievances dealing with discipline and non-selection for example. Our public sector steward training focuses on helping our representatives discern when an issue may involve agencies beyond just the employer.

Certified police officers, deputies and state correctional officers are subject to certification suspension or revocation by the Police Standards and Training Council (PSTC). Depending on the alleged conduct, the Conduct Review Committee (CRC) will review the Internal Investigation Report from the member's agency and decide whether the investigation was valid. The CRC can find that the investigation was valid, but the allegation of misconduct was *Not Sustained*. Our stewards help to educate all our members about the pitfalls of not asserting their Weingarten Rights from the beginning of any allegation or investigation into alleged misconduct.

After training, the public sector stewards know the significance of members being given their Garrity Rights prior

to the investigative interview. Garrity precludes a public sector employer from sharing the information gathered during a compelled administrative interview with a criminal investigator. Depending on the seriousness of the alleged misconduct, the public sector employer can refer the matter for the Attorney General's Public Integrity Unit (PIU) for possible criminal charges. Normally, this type of referral would result in the certified officer being suspended during the pendency of the PIU's investigation.

The above brief overview of what a steward may encounter with a member reinforces the importance of a trained steward and why Principal Officer Jeff Padellaro encourages and supports the ongoing effort to provide quality training to our stewards. The role of the steward is to assist in the education of our members and to encourage our members to assert their Weingarten Rights. Stewards will then notify the Business Agent, or Field Representative, about the potential for discipline and work with the Business Agent in the representation of the member.

Stewards are Union Officials and are an integral part of the Teamsters Union. Whether you are a new steward or have been a steward and would like a refresher course prior to the scheduled seminar held by the Local, please reach out to your Business Agent or Field Representative to set up a time convenient for you to complete same. A sincere thank you to all our stewards and members who make this Local Union a strong advocate on behalf of all our bargaining units. It is because of our outstanding public sector stewards and members that our public sector footprint in the State of New Hampshire continues to grow.

As our country gets ready to celebrate its 250th, Local 633 honors the hands that built America and all that our members do to keep this country moving. Happy 250th to you and yours!

# Report of Field Representative James Petrillo



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we roll into summer, I hope everyone had a great holiday season and that you and your families are healthy and doing well.

I would like to take a moment to thank everyone who took the time out of their busy schedules to vote in the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Delegate Election. It is my pleasure to represent our great Local, and it is an honor to attend the Teamsters Convention and stand alongside my fellow delegates: Jeff Padellaro, Jeff Parkinson, Rick Laughton, William Cahill, Keith Judge, Traci St. Clair, and Scott Gove.

Since our last newsletter, we have had the privilege of negotiating two contracts with PepsiCo in Manchester, New Hampshire.

The first contract covers our Warehouse Workers, BCR Representatives, Merchandisers, Bulk Drivers, D-Bay Drivers, and Mechanics. Through these negotiations, we secured significant wage increases, two personal days, a two-track disciplinary system (separating attendance and work performance), a \$5.00 increase to the pension contribution effective immediately, and language preventing members from being forced to work more than seven consecutive days. These are just a few of the many improvements contained in this agreement, which was overwhelmingly approved by the membership.

The second agreement covers our Pre-Sell Representatives. These Brothers and Sisters service small-format stores such as convenience stores and gas stations, placing product orders, stocking shelves, and building displays. This contract includes significant wage increases, improved recall rights, an additional personal day, and a two-track disciplinary system. Like the warehouse agreement, this contract was overwhelmingly approved by the membership and contains numerous improvements that will benefit our members for years to come.

We also recently concluded negotiations with the Town of Derry Department of Public Works.

The Brothers and Sisters in Derry secured wage increases, improvements to shift differential and standby duty pay, and substantial health insurance savings. By July 2028, the Town will pay 92.5% of health insurance premiums. These are just a few examples of the benefits that come with a strong Teamster contract.

We would like to thank all of the members who served on these

Negotiating Committees. Their dedication, preparation, and commitment were instrumental in achieving these gains. We could not secure these improvements without their hard work and support.

Looking ahead, we are entering negotiations with Bimbo Bakeries and Casella Waste Systems. We will continue to keep the membership informed as those negotiations progress.

As another school year comes to a close, we would like to thank all of our members at First Student and Student Transportation of America - including drivers, monitors, dispatchers, and mechanics - for their dedication and professionalism in safely transporting children to and from school each day. We would also like to thank all the members who took the time to participate in the vote on the First Student Master Agreement.

We would also like to remind everyone that Camp Allen is right around the corner. This year's event will be held on July 19, 2026, at Hampton Beach State Park. Camp Allen is one of the highlights of the year. It is always rewarding to see the campers enjoying the beach, spending time with friends and family, enjoying the generous food donations provided by employers represented by Local 633, and dancing to the music throughout the day. We look forward to another memorable event.

Additionally, our annual Local 633 Golf Tournament will be held on September 20, 2026, at The Oaks Golf Links in Somersworth, New Hampshire. We look forward to seeing everyone who participates. It is always a great day filled with camaraderies, competition, and fun.

## Organizing Department

As we write this article, we hope everyone is safe and healthy, and we want to thank all of the members who continue to send organizing leads our way. The Executive Board and Organizing Department would like to welcome our newest members to the Teamsters Local 633 family.

Since our last newsletter, we have successfully organized:

- Leach Public Library, Londonderry, NH - 13 members
- Greys Recycling, Pelham, NH - 3 members
- Pembroke Department of Public Works - 15 members

The Organizing Department is currently working on several additional organizing campaigns. As these efforts continue to develop, we will keep the membership informed of our progress.

We currently have an organizing drive underway with the Tilton Police Department, where 14 patrol officers are seeking Teamster representation. These officers have spoken with members from other law enforcement units represented by Local 633 and appreciate the way we advocate for and represent our members.

We are also working with Merrimack County Corrections Supervisors, a group of 13 employees who reached out to us after seeing the outstanding representation and advocacy provided by William Cahill on behalf of our members at the facility.

In closing, I want you to know that the continued growth and success of Teamsters Local 633 depends on each and every one

of you. We rely on our membership to spread the word about the benefits of Teamster representation and the value of union solidarity.
